Seabirds of Concern

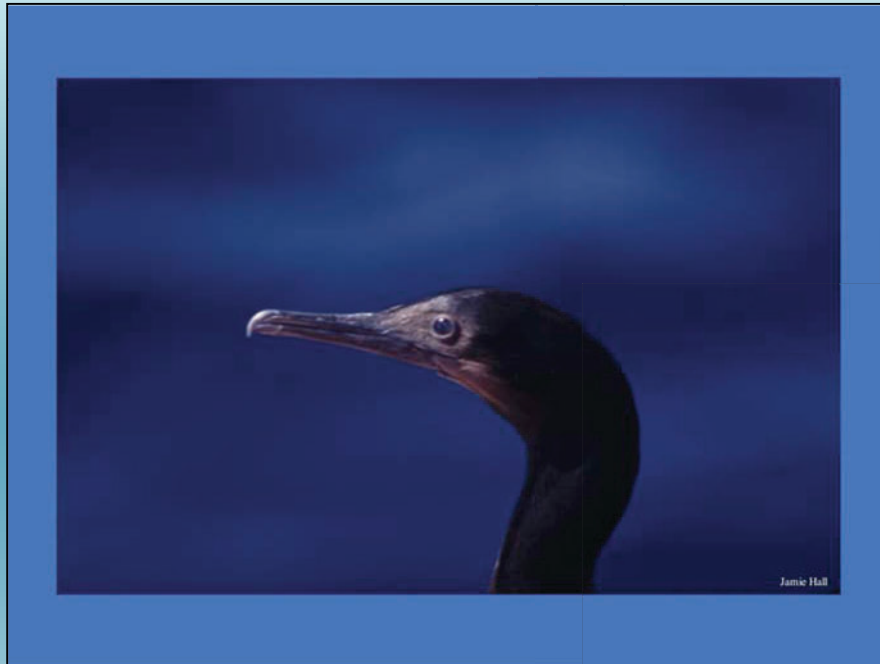
Breeding and roosting seabirds that nest and rest on cliffs or offshore rocks that are highly susceptible to negative impacts to their populations caused by human disturbance.

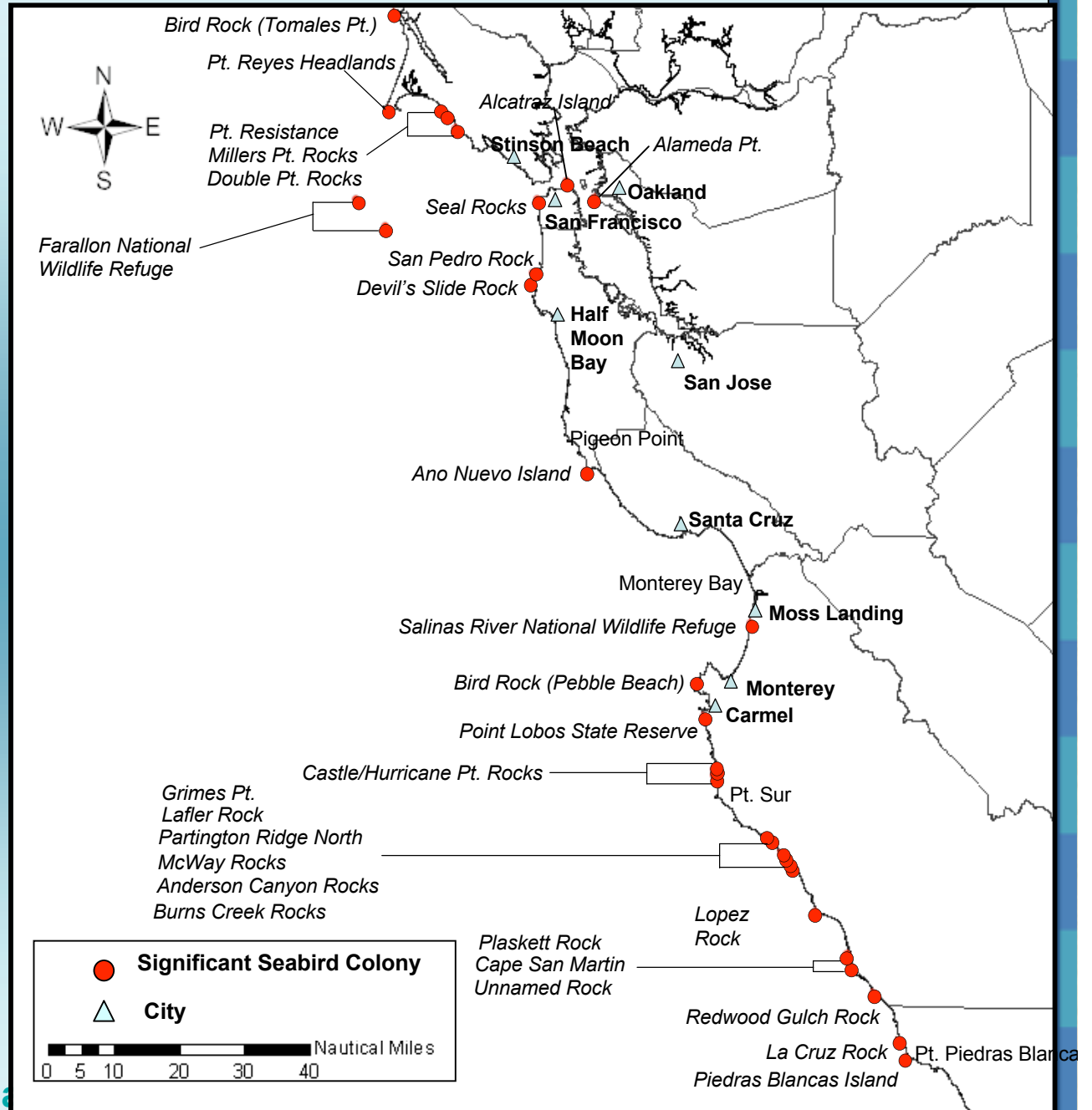

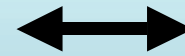
Timeline of Actions
